A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, dyslexia is a language-based learning disability that affects 10 to 15 percent of Americans and impacts a child's success in a conventional classroom; and

WHEREAS, neurological in origin, dyslexia affects the way the brain processes information, and is the leading cause of difficulties with reading, writing and spelling; and

WHEREAS, those with dyslexia benefit greatly from specialized assistance from highly trained teachers, multi-sensory learning programs and individualized instruction; and

WHEREAS, early identification, alternative instruction and extra support from friends, family and teachers can contribute to the success dyslexic students enjoy in the classroom and later on in employment;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, PAT McCRORY, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim October 2015, as "**DYSLEXIA AWARENESS MONTH**" in North Carolina, and commend its observance to all citizens.
